The San Joaquin Quartet:

Zina Schiff, violin, is an internationally acclaimed soloist and recording artist. She is a graduate of the Curtis School of Music was a protege of Jascha Heifetz. The latest addition to her extensive discography is the violin concerto of Ernest Bloch, which she recorded with the Royal Scottish National Orchestra for the Naxos record label. Zina lives in Boston and in Tiburon.

Oscar Hasbun, violin, a native of El Salvador, studied with William Primrose at the University of Indiana. He is a member of the Marin Symphony and many other ensembles, and teaches violin and viola in Daly City.

Steven Machtinger, viola, is a member of the Marin Symphony and a board member of The Bay Institute. He played second violin in the Meremblum Youth Symphony in Los Angeles when Zina Schiff was its concertmistress. Steve is a partner with Bingham McCutchen in San Francisco, where he practices securities law.

Louella Hasbun, cello, is a graduate of the Manhattan School of Music, where she studied with David Sawyer. She is a member of the Marin Symphony and other Bay Area ensembles, and teaches cello and piano.
